Board Member Reports - Potential Open Leadership Positions (Lead?)

- **President & Vice Presidents**: (Jim Perry President; Chris Curtis 1st VP; Charlie Olchowski 2nd VP)
  - <u>NEWS</u>:

- We were awarded a \$1,250 (\$1,000 net) grant from the Community Foundation of Western Massachusetts for Climate Change work. (Any special projects we should apply our share to?) Anything we can do to promote recycling. Possibly mini-grants (Terry). Deerfield has a plan for healthy soils. Anything we can do to promote healthy soils. The Plan has recommendations. Deerfield could be a model. Chris could come up with some details at the next meeting (Chris C). Fund student activities or Scholarships under our name (Chris B). Board members should bring proposals forward for the next meeting.
- Jim Perry and Kelsey Wentling, (replacing Andrea Donlon as the CRC Massachusetts River Steward) *toured the Deerfield River on Nov.* 1
- After Board review, filed a Comment letter with MassDEP in support of the New Proposed Revisions to the Water Management Program Regulations (310 CMR 36.00) and with the attached additional comments.
- Prepared a monitoring grant **commitment letter** for Ryan.
- After Andy Fisk met with us last month, donated over a thousand dollars.
- Ron Rhodes, the new Acting Director also made a substantial donation.
  Ron would like to meet with Jim and Patrick to see what remains to be done in regard to finances and the full Board after things get settled a bit.

- <u>CRC Liaison</u>: Latest news. (Ryan) *Ron is onboard. An opportunity for better communications. Diana will be the new Communications Director.*
- Watershed Projects:
  - <u>Northern Watershed Update</u> Update on what types or issues and actions are occurring in the Vermont end of the Deerfield River watershed. (Jack Widness) North Branch of Deerfield at Snow Lake. There was a State site visit. They will be taking testimony on the Master Plan. There will be a drop dead date to get the project completed. TU plans fisheries projects on the river.
  - Franklin County Rivers Source to Sea Cleanup (formerly, The Green River Cleanup) and the Greenfield City Cleanup. – Status Update. (David Boles, Charlie Olchowski) Different ideas were discussed for spending the money beyond our expenses.
    - \$2950 in donations tied to the Franklin County Rivers Cleanup, plus many vendors donated goods! Great work, David!

- Also, as previously mentioned, Trout Unlimited did their own Deerfield River cleanup.
- <u>Green River Watershed Alliance</u> Status Update. (Ryan O'Donnell and David Boles)
  - The Green River Watershed Alliance mailed out 500 letters and brochures to Vermont watershed residents. The letters contained a number of hikes and informational events held last summer and this fall. November 30, at 12:00 there will be a Zoom meeting to discuss bi-state cooperation on the Green River Watershed. The hope is that we will help with mailing out letters and brochures to Massachusetts residents this coming year and host hikes and events in the watershed. There are about 18,500 residents on the Massachusetts side of the Green River watershed; 2,530 outside of Greenfield. (Jim mailed paper copies to Board members)
  - I noticed that in 2020, the Windham Regional Commission donated \$5000 to us.
- <u>Monitoring</u> Status Update and discuss invoicing process. (Ryan O'Donnell) Would like to monitor nitrogen in addition to bacteria and purchase necessary equipment. Might partner with TU to do continuous monitoring. Such as conductivity monitoring. 2021 Report on To Do List.
- <u>Wild & Scenic Rivers</u> Status. Next steps. (Chris Curtis with Charlie Olchowski and Patrick McCoy) Reached out to Markey and McGovern's staff. How to keep the momentum going with the new Congress? How do we start the study without Federal funding? What would meet NPS standards so we are not just doing it on our own? Local study presented to the Park Service is another option. It is the State Initiated approach. We could apply for grants. \$220,000 is typical when going the Park Service route. Patrick is willing to help if we go the state initiated route.

#### How the Motion is Brought Before the Assembly

• A member makes the motion: I move that (or "to")

- Another member seconds the motion: *I second the motion*
- The chair states the motion: It is moved and seconded

2. The President says: *Those in favor, say 'Aye'*. (Pause for response.)

*Those opposed, say 'Nay'*. (Pause for response.) *Those abstaining, please say 'Aye'*.

#### The President announces the result of the vote.

1. *The ayes have it, the motion carries, and* ... (indicating the effect of the vote) or

2. The nays have it and the motion fails.

## **HOST Initiating Google Meet**
